

## Year 1 Summer Term Home Learning Activities. Week 8

These are the activities that we would have been covering in the curriculum at school. Don't forget to utilise Twinkl as they will have a lot of useful resources for all subjects. Go to the **School closure home learning** page.

Maths- Place Value. I am preparing this in advance but by the time you need this maths you may find that the website below has prepared a set of weekly lessons using the same of very similar ideas. Feel free to use it as well or instead of our suggestions

- Comparing numbers – show the children some 2-digit numbers arranged in tens and ones, get them to explain which one is greater and why. Get them to tell you which one is lesser and why. Explain that we are going to learn how to use the following signs, <, >, and =. Now give them two numbers at a time and encourage them to use the symbols.
- Comparing and ordering numbers - Draw a number line with only the multiples of 10 marked on it. Can they tell you where the following numbers belong on the number line, 56 and 65, 23 and 46, 68 and 86, 37 and 48. talk about which of the pair of numbers is greater and which is smaller.
- Ordering numbers - Give your child a range of numbers to put in order, get them to explain what they are doing and why. Try these numbers 57, 8, 21 and 100, 93, 72.
- One more one less - Using the following number cards 7, 5, 9, and 6 can they make a 2-digit number? What is the biggest number they can make and why? What is the smallest number they can make? What other numbers can they make? Now get them to make a 2-digit number and tell you what one more is and one less. Repeat as necessary.

English- If we were in school we would be reading pirates love underpants and looking at rhyming words. You can find it here [https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Vd8\\_Y1bEzA8](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Vd8_Y1bEzA8)

- Find a rhyming story or use the one suggested above. Can your child here which words rhyme when you read it? Can they find them in the text?
- Now find the rhyming words together and help them to think of alternative rhymes and make a string of rhyming words. To make this fun you could fold a piece of paper into a concertina and they could write one word of the rhyming on each fold.
- The challenge for this week will be to write 2 or 3 sentences about pirates that rhyme.
- Our grammar focus this week is using capital letters for proper nouns. Find a text with names in and get your child to spot the names of people and places noticing that they have capital letters. Now get them to make a pirate name for each member of the family such as One Eyed Charlie using capital letters as appropriate to write them doen

## Reading and spelling

- Please read with your child as often as possible. Remember to focus on sounding out and re-blending unfamiliar words, recognising common exception words on sight, retelling the information/story that they have read, and answering comprehension and inference questions.
- Please continue to practice spelling a few of the common exception words each week.

## Phonics

- In the Summer term, we would be focusing heavily on the phase 5 phonemes (you would have received these at parent's evening). There is a useful home learning pack on the Twinkl website called 'Phase 5 phonic activity booklet'.
- Don't forget to spot the phase 5 graphemes when reading your books.
- Phonicsplay has some useful activities and games that you can play at home.

In our foundation subjects this week we would have been looking at maps of islands and noticing that they have a key and a compass rose. We would then have drawn a map of a pretend island including a compass rose, a key and

other island features such as beaches, cliffs, rivers... We would also have been singing sea shanties and looking at their history. I warn you it is quite tricky to find age appropriate songs!!!
