

## Year 1 Summer Term Home Learning Activities.

These are the activities that we would have been covering in the curriculum at school. Don't forget to utilise Twinkl as they will have a lot of useful resources for all subjects. Go to the **School closure home learning** page.

### Maths- Money

- Begin by looking at any coins you have at home (you can use the twinkl resource to search for coin recognition powerpoints and posters if needed). Discuss the colour and shape of the coins in order to build familiarity with them. Use this link to play a coin sorting game to enhance coin recognition <https://www.topmarks.co.uk/money/coins-game>.
- Look at the 5p coin. Explain that this is the same as five 1p coins. Repeat for other examples (3p, 6p, 8p) using objects around the house to make a 'shop'.
- Challenge – What coins would you need to buy these items?

### English-

- In class we would have been looking at the text 'Pirates Love Underpants' to explore poetry and rhyme. Share the book at home if you have it or watch it using the link below. [https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Vd8\\_Y1bEzA8](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Vd8_Y1bEzA8). See if you can spot the rhyming words in the text.
- Discuss some ideas about pirates to create a small verse. Think about what they look like, what they might wear, what could they be doing? Remember to start a new idea on a new line. As a challenge see if you can include some rhyming words!

Eg. Pirates can wear a cap

When they look for treasure with a map.

- Our grammar focus this week would be using a capital letter when writing a proper noun (names and places). Write a sentence or two using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops using a capital letter for a proper noun. For example, I like to play with my friend Tim in the playground.

### Reading and spelling

- Please read with your child as often as possible. Remember to focus on sounding out and reblending unfamiliar words, recognising common exception words on sight, retelling the information/story that they have read, and answering comprehension and inference questions.

- Please continue to practice spelling a few of the common exception words each week.

### Phonics

- In the Summer term, we would be focusing heavily on the phase 5 phonemes (you would have received these at parent's evening). There is a useful home learning pack on the Twinkl website called 'Phase 5 phonic activity booklet'.
- Don't forget to spot the phase 5 graphemes when reading your books.
- Phonicsplay has some useful activities and games that you can play at home.

This week we would have been making pirate finger puppets, with the emphasis on joining materials together. We would have used felt to create two finger templates and then joined them together by sewing them or using glue. You could create your own pirate finger puppet at home using paper, card or felt if you have any. You could decorate the pirate too to show what the pirate might have worn (hat, earring, eye patch). Use the pirate to act out your favourite pirate story or poem, or you could even make up your own! Use the links and pictures below for some ideas and have fun!
