

Seaside shop

This week's focus in maths is money. In order to help your child with the concept of money, together with your child create a seaside shop. There are a few pictures to show how it can be organised. Together with your child look at the available resources at home and decide how your shop is going to look like.

Find some things you might be "selling" in the seaside shop. Think widely, it can be anything from beads and pictures of ice cream. Once you have made up the list of the things, you will need to put tags and prices. Below, there are some ideas you might find useful. Finally, you will need a till with money (this could be a bag or basket. You could use toy or real money (if available), alternatively you can print out the template below or draw your own coins for 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p. Once your shop has been set up ask your child to label how much each item costs and invite people to buy them using the coins you have made. Encourage them to recognise the value of each coin. What happens if someone wants to buy two items? Remember to label the items so they are the same price as the coins you have made otherwise it will be tricky for them to work out which coins they need to use.
