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

Dear Parents and Carers,

Covid 19

As you may have seen in the local news, two schools in Plymouth are completely closed for a ten-day quarantine period due to active Covid cases in the school population. We have been very fortunate thus far, and keeping to the playground mask rule, one way system and socially distancing will help us to stay that way and help to prevent anyone from needing to self-isolate at the start of the summer holidays. I would like to draw your attention to the government advice regarding symptoms and which test to use. If you or your child are experiencing any of the Covid symptoms we are all familiar with, or any of the additional symptoms associated with the Delta variant, which includes cold type symptoms, you should be arranging for a PCR test, as lateral flow tests can produce a negative result even when symptomatic.
