Plants & Animals

In Science, the children in Year 2 have started to learn about plants and animals. The children explored the site for plants and animals in our playground environment. The children worked as scientists by observing different areas of the school and recorded what they saw and where they saw it. The children recorded seeing lime trees, snails, seagulls, and a variety of plants.



KIND HANDS, KIND FEET, KIND WORDS, KIND ACTIONS



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Art

After learning about Henry Moore, his life and his influences, Year 6 used crayon, chalk, and different coloured paper to recreate some of Moore's artwork. The children have been particularly focussed on his artwork commissioned during WW2, which links to our current learning in History.



PSHRE

In PSHRE (Personal, Social, Health & Relationship Education), children in Year 1 we have been learning about the skills needed to work well with a partner. The children practised mirroring each other's movement and then collaborated to set a shared goal.



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Thermal Conductors

In Science, the Year 5 children conducted an investigation to see which material is the best thermal conductor. They tested three variables: a wooden spoon, a plastic spoon and a metal spoon and timed how long it took for an ice cube to melt when placed over a container of hot water.



Geography

Year 4 children have been investigating where our food comes from by searching for places of origin on food packaging for items like fruits and vegetables. This forms part of their unit of learning in Geography.



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Forces & Friction

In Science, the Year 3 children have been learning about forces and friction. Children have used the Newton meters to measure the force needed to pull a shoe across the different surfaces. They have discovered that the most slippery surfaces were the table and the lino, and that those surfaces reduced the friction, so they needed less force to pull the shoe.

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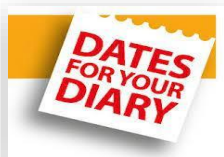
