British Science Week

During British Science Week, all children embarked on an engaging journey into the realm of scientific discovery, with a special focus on climate studies, a theme woven into our geography curriculum. This celebratory week provided a unique chance for children of all ages to uncover how scientists employ ice cores from Antarctica to delve into the mysteries of climate change. Highlighting the concept of layering in climate and weather, children in Year 1participated in crafting paper cores to reflect the weather patterns of the week. They learned the pivotal lesson that the oldest layers are situated at the bottom of these cores. This school-wide focus not only deepened our pupils' understanding of climate science but also showcased the practical applications of scientific enquiry in comprehending the earth's climatic past.



In Year 4, the spotlight was on innovating our school's spaces to foster a more eco-friendly environment. The children engaged in creative projects, from designing bug hotels to planning vegetable patches, demonstrating their commitment to making our school a greener place.

This memorable visit culminated in the children personally delivering their letters to her, marking a cherished experience in their literary journey.

In Music, Year 4 embarked on a delightful cross-curricular journey, blending French and Music by learning the classic tune "Frère Jacques." The children first mastered the lyrics in both French and English, then moved on to learn the melody on their recorders. With dedication and practice, they successfully performed "Frère Jacques" on their recorders, showcasing their newfound musical and linguistic skills. A round of applause for Year 4's impressive achievement!



PSED Learning

In recent PSED lessons, children in Reception explored the importance of health and body care, emphasising exercise and a balanced diet. The children discussed the value of sometimes enjoying treats but highlighted the necessity of fruits and vegetables. A playful moment occurred when EYFS teachers pretended to make a sandwich loaded with sweets and biscuits. The children intervened, suggesting healthier lunch options, demonstrating their grasp of nutrition and healthy eating habits.



Geography

In geography, Year 2 children combined their maths skills with their study of London by focusing on the city's famous landmarks and their popularity. They identified several landmarks and quantified their popularity, translating this information into bar charts. This exercise required thoughtful consideration on how to represent millions of tourists visually, along with the inclusion of a title and labels for the x and y axes. To bring their data to life, some children creatively used cubes to create physical representations of their bar charts.
