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Self Portraits



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
Classifying Materials

If you live in Plymouth, you can apply for a secondary school place for your child from 4 September 2023. If you do not live in Plymouth but want to apply for a Plymouth school, you will need to apply through your local council.

Arrival & Dismissal

Please note that on arrival, children in Years 3 to 6 enter through the Junior Gate. Please be reminded that parents are not allowed to enter or to walk from the Infants' playground to access the back of the school.

For dismissal, we operate a one-way system for children in Years 3 to 6. Parents are reminded to enter through the back lane gate on the cobbled road. Parents are asked to wait on the top playground **only**. Parents waiting on the bottom of the playground will not be able to collect the children when coming from their classes. Children will only be dismissed from the top playground.

We ask parents to please leave the areas to the stairwell clear as well as the pathway for the children to walk.

The safety of our children is our utmost priority, and we ask for your continued support in following the procedure for arrival and dismissal so that all our children are safe at all times.

School Councils

Application for school councils is currently opened and the deadline has been extended to Monday, September 18th. Please note that late applications will not be accepted.
