Early Years Foundation Stage Our Prime Areas

In Communication and Language, we will begin to develop our oracy skills by talking to our friends and adults in school. We will enjoy sharing photos and videos from Tapestry that document our experiences at home, to an audience. We will develop vocabulary and talking with others through our daily story times.

In Physical Development, we will begin to explore our whole school PE scheme 'Complete PE'. We will learn about 'Using hands' to explore pushing, bouncing and rolling and understanding what 'control' means when playing games with a ball. We will also explore 'Walking' at different speeds, levels and directions and how we can implement walking in such ways into a game. We will be exploring a range of gross motor skills using our outside area. These big movements will help us refine our fine motor control for things like writing.

In Personal, Social and Emotional Development, we will follow Jigsaw (PSHCE). We will be thinking about 'Being me in my own world' and 'Celebrating difference'. We will have class discussions and share our own experiences with our friends.



Other areas

Our Cabin encompasses all areas of learning outdoors. We will develop our confidence and self-esteem through learner inspired, hands on experiences in a natural setting. As Religious Enquirers we will be exploring Christianity. Discussions and activities will be woven into the free flow provision.

Early Years Foundation Stage Our Specific Areas

In RWI, we will begin to learn the sounds that the letters of the alphabet make. We will explore 'Fred talk' to blend pure sounds together to make words. We are learning how to form letters correctly and beginning to hold a pencil with the correct grip.

As Mathematicians, we will start to learn numbers to 5. We will be able to subitise numbers to five. We will be able to spot numbers in the environment and confidently count objects. We will use the term more and fewer to describe groups of objects.

In Understanding the World, we will begin to explore the physical world and community through play. We will have opportunities to observe people, places, technology and the natural environment. We will choose what we'd like to learn more about through our child led curriculum.

In Expressive Art and Design, we will have opportunities to explore a variety of materials and colours. We will begin to learn simple joining techniques using a range of tools. We will explore colour mixing and a range of textures. We will begin to create simple representations of events, people and objects
