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Dear Parents, Guardians, Carers,

As we begin the Summer 1 Term at Hyde Park Infants' School, we are excited to share with you a weekly outline of learning to enrich your child's learning journey. This term, we'll explore a variety of topics, each carefully chosen to stimulate curiosity, foster growth, and encourage a love for learning. Through a blend of engaging activities and useful online resources, we aim to support you in guiding your child's educational experience at home. We look forward to a term filled with discovery, growth, and joy.

Week 1: Introduction to journey tales.

- Maths Objective: Count in 2's, 5's and 10's.
 - Activity: Look for objects arranged in 2's, 5's and 10's and practise counting
- English Objective: Explore journey stories in which pirates travel to a place and overcome adversity along the way.
 - Activity: read stories that involved travelling such as the Gruffalo and The Bad-tempered Ladybird and write about the main character.
- Science: Plants.
 - Activity: Take a walk in the park and talk about the different plants you see.
- **History:** To know who pirates were and what their life was like.
 - Activity: Talk about the jobs that need to be done to keep a ship at sea such as master gunner, captain, quartermaster and swabbies.

Week 2: Our families

- **Objective:** Learn about various different families.
- Maths Objective: To double numbers up to 10
 - Activity: using objects practice double practically

- **English Objective:** Explore journey stories in which pirates travel to a place and overcome adversity along the way.
 - **Activity:** Write a story about a character who travels and their adventures.





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- **PSHRE:** Being a good friend.
 - Activity: Role-play ways to be a good friend.
- **RE:** Understanding Shabbat
 - Activity: Think about ways to relax.

Week 3: Physical Education and Health

- **Objective:** Emphasise the importance of physical activity and healthy eating.
- Maths Objective: To make equal groups by sharing.
 - Activity: share out amounts of fruit between 2, 3, 4 and 5 people
- English Objective: Write a journey story.
 - Activity: make a puppet and use it to tell a story.
 - Website: <u>Storyline Online</u>
- **PE:** Participate in daily physical activities.
 - Activity: Family walk or dance session.
 - Website: <u>GoNoodle</u>
 - Science: To know the parts for plant.
 - Activity: Go on a walk and finds plants name the main parts.

Week 4: Plants

- **Objective:** The uses of plants.
- Maths Objective: To recognise half of a shape.
 - Activity: Cut out some shapes and practise folding them accurately in half colour half.
 - English Objective: Exploring riddles.
 - Activity: Explore riddles that you know.
- Science: To know that plants have many uses.
 - Activity: Search your home for ways that plants are used. (food, medicine, materials)

Week 5: Exploring Numbers and Shapes

- **Objective:** Develop mathematical skills related to numbers and shapes.
- Maths Objective: To find half of a quantity.
 - Activity: Share objects between two people.
- English Objective: Write a riddle.
 - Activity: Write a riddle to share with the family.
- Science: To know what plants need to grow.

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Activity: Grow seeds in pots and observe changes.

Week 6: Creativity and Expression through Art (Activities week)

- **Objective:** Encourage creativity and self-expression through different art forms.
- Maths Objective: to describe positions using language such as; above, below, left, right, behind and in front.
 - **Activity:** put a teddy above below left and right of a chair and ask the child to describe that Teddy's position.
- English Objective: Share the riddles on this link and see who can answer them.

- Art: Using chalk pastels to draw flowers in the style of Georgia O'Keefe
 - Activity: use chalks to draw on paving.

 - Activity: listen to various pieces of music and decide which is their favourite.
