Dear Parents,

This week was very special for all the children in Ash, Cedar and Oak classes as they went on an adventure to Saltram and had lots of fun building dens, finding out about trees, visiting hidden places and playing in the play park. Thank you to all the parents who joined us for the trip and helped out with the children's questions, play and explorations. In school, all the children have been asking **Big Questions** and these questions and ideas are to be found displayed in the school hall. The children have been asking questions about facilities in their local community and they will be inviting in local people to help answer their enquiries. Please pop in to the main hall any time before school to have a look or use time during Parents' Evening if that is more convenient.

Half term activities and fun

- Children from the Hyde Park Schools are invited to take part in a colouring/painting/collage competition as part of historical celebrations that will be happening in Freedom Park. The event is to mark the Siege of Plymouth and the Sabbath Day fight which occurred between the Parliamentarians (Roundheads) and Royalists (Cavaliers) on 3rd December 1643. The event will be held near the Café at Freedom Park and will involve the Lord Mayor, her Consort and the Sealed Knot group who will be in costume and re-inact the scene that occurred 374 years ago. Displayed at the event will be the children's pictures which must not be bigger or smaller than A4 (the size of my newsletters when I send you a paper copy) I would like to receive all the pictures as soon as possible in the week we return to school after half term, please. The Mayor will award small prizes for pictures from children in different age groups and there will be a Head Teacher sticker for all entrants. This would be an ideal activity to try out during half term!
- The picture could be of a Roundhead, a Cavalier, a battle, a siege, King Charles I or anything connected with the Sabbath Day Fight. More information is available online by typing in Plymouth Sabbath Day Fight into your preferred search engine. A basic outline of a cavalier and a Roundhead is attached to this newsletter which can be used for guidance or just decorated if you don't have time for your own research. The event will take place in the Freedom Park on Sunday 3rd December where I hope to see as many children and families there as possible to enjoy finding out about our Plymouth heritage.
- The Hyde Park Explorers packs are proving very popular and will provide hours of free fun over half term. Children's photos, pictures, writing and reports can all be submitted to school and then I can share them on the school website for others to view. Please keep sending in accounts of explorations in Hyde Park.
- There are lots of opportunities to volunteer at Central Park where children and adults can make new friends, learn skills, give back and enjoy nature.
