What we are doing in school:

- The children are encouraged to wear their sun hats when outside
- The children are encouraged to drink plenty of water during the school day and this can be topped up in school if they finish their water
- Additional water is available from the two water fountains in the playground

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- There are a number of areas of shade in the playground and the children are encouraged to
 use them. The lunchtime game activities are based in the shade when we have sunny
 weather
- To protect children's skin from the sun, there is now a relaxing of the school uniform so that long sleeves or long trousers can be worn by both girls and boys in a cool and loose fitting style (probably cotton)

How you can help at home:

- Please ensure that your child has a sun hat (named please) that they can wear to school and every time they go outside for play and also on the walk home.
- Please send your child to school each day with a full water bottle
- Please apply sun cream to exposed parts of your child's body that will last the day.
- If your child has particularly sensitive skin, you are welcome to come on site at 12.15 for Y1 and Y2 children and 1.00 for Early Years children, to apply cream to your own child.
- Following the relaxation of uniform rules, you may send your child into school with loose long sleeved top and loose fitting trousers that cover exposed parts.

Together we can help your child enjoy the hot weather but keep safe when the sun is shining and by being well hydrated in this heat. Thank you to the parents who have taken time to speak to me about their concerns about the dangers of the sun. I hope that collectively we can support all the children to keep safe.
