

Measurement – week 5	What you need	Activity
<p><b>Monday</b></p> <p>Unit of measurement and reading scales</p>	<p>Jug Bag of sugar/flour Weighing scale</p>	<p>If you have them in your house you will need:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- A jug</li> <li>- A bag of sugar/flour</li> <li>- Weighing scale</li> </ul> <p>First look at the jug, can they find the scale? What is the unit of measurement (millilitres or litres?) Explain that there are 1000ml in one litre. Fill the jug up with some liquid and ask your child to read the scale and tell you how much liquid is in the jug. Repeat with a different amount. Now look at the bag of sugar/flour – can you see how much it weighs? What is the unit of measurement (grams and kilograms). If you have a scale weigh different items and ask your child to read the scales. Repeat with a different item, is it heavier/lighter</p>
<p><b>Tuesday</b></p> <p>Unit of measurement and reading scales</p>	<p>Thermometer Ruler</p>	<p>If you have them in your house you will need:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Ruler</li> <li>- Thermometer</li> </ul> <p>Look at your ruler – what is the unit of measurement (centimetres and metres). How do you measure with a ruler? Ask your child to accurately measure different items in your house (starting at 0 on the scale and holding it still). Repeat with a different item.</p>

		Look at your thermometer – how does it record the temperature of your body? What is the unit of measurement? Demonstrate how to take your child’s temperature if it is appropriate. Explain that an adult should always do this and not a child.

They have some great power point presentations for you to look through together with your child which will explain how to read scales and have some quizzes for you to do together.</p>
<b>Thursday</b>  Reading scales	Internet access	Search for a reading scales worksheet on the Twinkl website (KS1) there are many on there so choose one that is suitable for your child to complete. Work through the worksheet together, ensure your child reads the scales accurately. Some of the scales jump in 2s, 5s and 10s. It might be helpful to point this out before your child starts to complete their work.
<b>Friday</b>  Reading scales	Recipe Baking ingredients and equipment	Choose a recipe together depending on what ingredients you have in your house and ask your child to help weigh out and measure all of the ingredients accurately. Then follow the instructions on the recipe. This is an excellent activity to support your child’s learning. Please make sure you wash your hands before and after touching any ingredients.
